Appointment of Alternate Directors

Nominations for alternate directors closed on Friday, 21 October 2016. Following a rigorous interview process and extensive deliberation, the Dawang Council appointed Lawford Benning and Skye Peart as alternate directors during its meeting on 26 October 2016. The role of alternate director is detailed in the MG Corporation Rule Book. Rule 14.8 lists two ways in which alternate directors may be used by the Board:

- i) as proxies, in the event that directors are unable to attend a board meeting; and
- ii) as trainees, in order to train to be a (non-alternate) director.

The Rule Book also allows for alternate directors to be appointed as (non-alternate) directors in the event that a position becomes vacant on the Board. MG Corporation thanks all members who nominated for alternate director roles.
