

No more pain: Declaration on family and domestic violence



In late July, men from across the East Kimberley attended a Community Forum on Family and Domestic Violence held at Kununurra Waringarri Aboriginal Corporation.

Prominent leaders from Binarri-binyja Yarrawoo Aboriginal Corporation, Kununurra Waringarri Aboriginal Corporation and MG Corporation were among the attendees who met to discuss matters relating to family and domestic violence. The forum resulted in a strong declaration: "As men, we understand that our families and our communities are under enormous pressure and are hurting. We need to stand up and declare that we will not tolerate this any longer. Violence and suicide is not part of our culture."

The group agreed that the time has come for action and acknowledged that violence is a symptom of deeper issues including intergenerational trauma, the loss of language and culture, lack of strong leadership, poverty and racism. Agreement was reached on the following guiding principles:

- 1. Men need to take action on men's issues and provide leadership to younger men.
- 2. Aboriginal organisations in Kununurra must stand up and support strong culture.
- 3. Strong men help create strong families.

The group are calling on all men in Kununurra to come together for a bush meeting to talk about what's happening, why it's happening and what men can do to play a part in the solution.
