## MoU SIGNED WITH SHIRE

MG Corporation has signed a Memorandum of Understanding with the Shire of Wyndham-East Kimberley to strengthen the relationship between MG people and the council.

The MoU is designed to drive a collaborative working relationship between the two parties, and to encourage the participation of MG people in the East Kimberley economy, while enabling the Shire to deliver amenities to the community.

MGC executive chair Lawford Benning said signing the MoU was just the start.

"MG Corporation expects the MoU will give us a pathway for our Traditional Owners to provide cultural guidance to the council through meaningful community engagement with MG people," he said. "We are hopeful this MoU will lead to a new understanding between the Shire and MG people, bringing a fundamental change to the way we do business."

The MoU was officially signed at a ceremony on May 22 after the endorsement of both the Council and the MGC Board of Directors.

### MGC MAKES HISTORY MANAGING TARGET 120

#### MG Corporation is proud to be the first Aboriginal Community Controlled Organisation in Western Australia funded to deliver the State Government's Target 120 program.

The program works to reduce juvenile reoffending rates and helps at-risk young people aged between 10 and 14 years old to get their lives back on track.

MGC executive chair Lawford Benning said it was important that programs for Aboriginal people be delivered by Aboriginal people. "The cultural component added as an activity will not only strengthen families' connection to country but more so allow them to embrace themselves freely on country which will be fundamental to their journey of healing as a family," Mr Benning said.

The Department of Communities had previously delivered the program since its launch in 2017.
